AN ORDINARY DEPOSIT, A HEAVY BOND

The front end is routine. The service bond at the back is among the heaviest in the country.

Deposits and rounds

A government-only candidate deposits Rs 10,000; a private or both-quota candidate Rs 1,00,000. Round 1 allows a free exit, and forfeiture begins in Round 2 for a seat you do not join.

⚠ SERVICE BOND BREACH

Rs 30,00,000 Break the service bond or leave the course midway and Assam's penalty runs to thirty lakh. Read the bond's service period in your admission papers before you accept a government seat.

✓ THE BOND IS THE BIGGER QUESTION

The deposit is a Round 2 matter; the bond is a multi-year one. Weigh it before you join.
