## THE RULE FORKS BY COLLEGE TYPE

What you must do after a Round 1 allotment depends on whether the college is government or private.

### Round 1 splits two ways

Round 1 offers a free exit, but the rule forks. Allotted a government college and you must take admission to stay in the process. Allotted a private college and you need not join, but you must still appear for physical document scrutiny at a nodal centre. Skip the scrutiny and you are out, whatever you intended.

### From Round 2

A Round 2 allotment you do not join forfeits the deposit. The usual order holds from there: join what you are given, or step away cleanly within the dates.

#### ✓ ATTEND SCRUTINY EVEN IF YOU PLAN TO LEAVE

Missing the document scrutiny ends your counselling by default, regardless of intent.
