THE STEEPEST GATE IN THE COUNTRY

A private-medical candidate puts down five lakh just to take part in choice-filling. Treat that form with the seriousness the number deserves.

The five-lakh deposit

A government-seat candidate puts down about Rs 10,000. A private-medical candidate puts down Rs 5,00,000. It is not a fee; it is a refundable deposit the state holds to keep casual applicants out. You get it back by joining a seat or exiting cleanly in Round 1. You lose all of it by taking a private allotment later and walking away.

Round 1 is safe

An allotment you don't report to in Round 1 costs nothing, and a withdrawal before the published deadline keeps the deposit whole. Use the round to learn what your rank actually fetches.

Round 2 is the trap

This is where five lakh can vanish in an afternoon. List a private college in Round 2 only after you have read its real tuition, hostel charge and bank-guarantee terms. A college you added just in case is the most expensive line on the form.

✓ VERIFY BEFORE YOU LIST

Read every private college's full cost before it goes on the Round 2 form, not after the allotment lands.
