WHY OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS COME HERE

UP's private colleges take non-domiciles, which makes the state a popular backup. The price of that backup is a two-lakh deposit.

The deposits

A government-seat candidate pays Rs 30,000. A private-medical candidate pays Rs 2,00,000, a private-dental candidate Rs 1,00,000. The money is refundable if you exit cleanly or join, and forfeited if you take an allotment from Round 2 and refuse it.

Round 1 is a free look

An allotment you skip in Round 1 costs nothing and carries you into Round 2. Use it to aim at the colleges you actually want.

Round 2 is the expensive one

From Round 2 a rejected allotment forfeits the full deposit. For an out-of-state candidate that is two lakh gone. Never list a private college you have not checked for tuition, hostel and bank-guarantee terms.

✓ TREAT THE ROUND 2 LIST AS BINDING

If you would not join a college and pay for it, keep it off the form.
